In November you met our newest member, Carolyn Conforti, and we are delighted to complete the year by sharing her family story with you.

In 1910 at age 18, my grandfather, Angelo Traina, left the town of Misilmeri (near Palermo, Sicily) for the land of opportunity. He ended up in Chicago where he worked three jobs

to make ends meet – his favorite being elevator operator at a big building downtown. His lively personality and love for people – and the 26 floors worth of time to interact with them – earned him very large tips! He was delighted when he went to church and heard the sermon spoken not in Latin, but in Italian. It was there he met my grandmother, Argia Giovannoni, who had immigrated from Lucca, Tuscany.

They married and raised nine children in a small

house on the southwest side of Chicago. Right after the Great Depression, they managed to buy it for \$5,000 and cram it into the basement so they could rent out the main floor to pay the mortgage. My grandmother grew tomatoes, vegetables, and flowers in the backyard

and made daily trips to the bakery to buy bread. Wanting desperately for the children to take advantage of the educational opportunities he never had, my grandfather was mortified when they started school and could not understand the lessons in English. He forbade them to speak Italian, and in hopes of the kids being more accepted in society, he tried to downplay immigrant stereotypes. There was a slight glitch, however, when his sons made some ominous playground threats about their non-existent "uncle" who "will make you regret that you ever made fun of us..." The taunting stopped and everyone survived, somehow. When my mother moved to Seattle and became a fourth-grade teacher, the self-described city girl met and married my dad, a country boy from a pioneering family in the remote northwest corner of Washington. I grew up in Port Orchard where we raised our own organic meat, vegetables, and fruit - long before this was

I married Steve Conforti, the great-grandson of Salvatore Conforti of San Pietro, Calabria, who had immigrated to Fall River, Massachusetts, and started his own barber shop. Salvatore's grandson – my father-in-law – had proudly served in the US Army in Korea and Vietnam, retiring in the Fort Lewis area. Fast forward a couple of decades: our daughter, wanting to embrace her roots, studied abroad in Florence and acted as our personal tour guide/interpreter on our first trip to Italy. I became enamored with the language that my mother had lost in her childhood and began my slow, steady, sweet journey to learn la bella lingua.

Recently I spoke a little bit of my humble Italian to



my mom. Although she has not heard her mother's voice in almost 70 years, she told me the language brings back memories of her mother talking. She assures me my grandparents are cheering me on. I am thrilled to be welcomed into the Sons and Daughters of Italy, this community that has treated me like family from the minute I walked in the door. I believe my grandparents are cheering us all on! Evviva! Carolyn Conforti
