Seattle. He is buried in Mt. Olivet Cemetery in Renton, Washington. When Arturo arrived in Black Diamond, like most Italian immigrants he knew nothing about coal mining. According to one description, he was a big man about 6.5 - 7 feet tall with an imposing frame. Since he was big and strong, the first job the mine gave him was pushing the coal car off to dump the rock. Each time he came out with a car he would yell, "Rock-a Car, Rock-a Car!" Later he would learn how to mine. Duda Vernarelli recalled the following story his uncle



told him. One night in the saloon a man would not stop bothering Big Arturo. After continually asking him to stop doing that, Arturo finally had enough so he grabbed the guy, lifted him off the floor above his head, and body slammed him back on the floor. That's how strong he was. Big Arturo was known to go on a drunk

occasionally, so after closing time he would walk up to the mine, get some sleep, then wake up, and go to work. Someone mentioned this to the mine superintendent who said, "Don't you worry. You just leave him alone. He'll sleep a couple hours, and he will turn out more coal than both of you guys together." A federal residence card from 1942 listed his occupation as a miner for the Dale Coal Company in Ravensdale where he also lived. There was some friction between the Italians and the Welsh due to the Italians not being able to speak English well. One night the Italians decided they had enough of this. The Italians gathered outside the saloon and Big Arturo, Big John, Big Andrew, along with Bear Franchini, went in and cleared the place out. As the Welsh were thrown out of the saloon, the Italians waiting outside continued the fight. Afterward that






