

#### Spring 2024 Grand Council-President Report

National Vice President, National Trustee, Grand Lodge Officers, Lodge Presidents, Deputies, and guests.

Since our last Grand Council, there has been several Grand Lodge Officer changes. This was a result of our Financial Secretary Paul Pioli and 4<sup>th</sup> Vice President Jeanne Fasano having to resign due to personal reasons. We are fortunate that Judy Anselmo accepted the appointment of 4<sup>th</sup> Vice President. Mary Jane Rogers accepted the appointment of Financial Secretary. We then filled their Trustee positions with Marcel Bergeron and Jackie Haberstock. I really appreciate these members stepping up and taking on their new responsibilities.

It is great to see the elections move smoothly and officers taking their positions for two year terms. This will be very important and helpful next year when we hold our Convention. All officers attending will have a full year of knowledge and experience to better understand the business of the convention and responsibility of electing the slate of Grand Lodge officers.

One area of concern is the Grand Lodge Financial standing. The Grand Lodge after Covid chose to hold back on fundraising to allow lodges to be the priority. The fundraising that has occurred since has been helpful. However, we are at a point financially where we will soon need to dip into our reserves. It is time to consider our options that will be brought forward and voted upon at our May 2025 Convention. Our current options separate to continuing fundraising are: increase per capita; reduce the number of editions for the NWIN, or make NWIN totally online.

Our membership numbers have dropped since December 2023. I am hoping that all lodges take the time to establish a membership committee to reach out to members who have recently dropped as well as those from years ago. Reaching out to your current members is also very important. Your membership committee should be reaching out to members who are not attending. Find out what is going on. Do they need a ride, health issues etc. Sometimes people aren't attending but would appreciate someone reaching out and checking in. As I have said, if the only time you contact your members is when it's time for dues... you are not connecting with your membership.

Yakima lodge is struggling. I am reaching out to you for help, ideas and ways to support and strengthen this lodge. Please contact me.

Imembers Data program is in full swing. All lodges are up and running. There are many ways to utilize this program. However, my focus is to ensure that your membership roster is up to date. As of May 20, we will use the imember roster for all information. This means who gets the NWIN, the Italian American Magazine, and Per capita information.

This should make it easier for all. The Ignite ap is a great option. This allows us to utilize our phones for connecting with our members, share information, photos, signup potential members. If you need more training or help, please contact me.

The Calendar raffle is about to get into motion, please sell them now vs just before the Fall Grand Council Oct. 5, 2024.

September is our big month for Italian community events. The San Gennaro Festival Sept 6-8, 2024 and Festa Seattle Sept 28-29 and Portland Festa? Volunteers are needed to help man the membership booth. 4 hour shifts....or whatever you can offer would be appreciated. Many lodges have gained members via these booths... Help us out.
